End Litter Now: Pass A U.S. Container Bill

WHY WE NEED A U.S. CONTAINER BILL

A national container deposit return program would create a simple system for the public to recycle their containers at stores, return centers, and reverse vending machine locations. This system reduces litter, creates jobs, increases the availability of recycled materials, and reduces impacts on the environment with proven policy. Saving resources saves money and protects natural spaces.

Here are a few benefits of this legislation:



In a 2020 national litter study, there was about twice as much more deposit-material litter per capita in non-bottle bill states than in bottle bill states. By this ratio, the US could cut our litter in half if we had a national bottle bill. (Source: Keep America Beautiful)



A national container deposit-return program would support nearly 100,000 US jobs and create 11 to 38 times more jobs than a curbside recycling system for beverage containers. (Source: Container Recycling Institute)



The revenue from unredeemed deposits would allow the U.S. and states to **invest billions of dollars** into improving our recycling systems and introduce recycling systems to **rural areas and recycling deserts.**



By cutting litter in half, we can also cut the costs of litter clean-up in half. The US spends \$11.5 billion each year on litter abatement – about \$9 billion of that expense is shouldered by U.S. businesses, while American taxpayers have to pay \$1.3 billion. (Source: Keep America Beautiful)

Incentive-based container deposit programs are easy, popular with consumers and businesses, and have been working for decades in many places across the country.

States with bottle bills overwhelmingly recycle at much higher rates than states without bottle bills. Nine of the top 12 recycling states have bottle bills. (Source: Eunomia's The 50 States of Recycling report)

The national container bill will not preempt existing container deposit laws in the 10 states that currently have them (CA, CT, HI, IA, ME, MA, MI, NY, OR, VT). However, states that have bottle bills could opt-into the federal program should they wish to do so.
